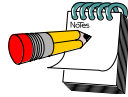

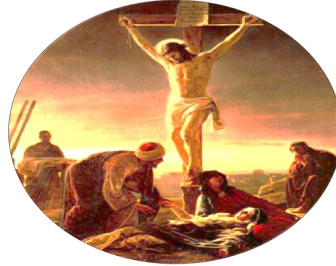

*From the Pastor*

Over the last year, our parish has been blessed with the labors of Deacon Patrick and Christina Moynihan. Although Deacon Moynihan is still working with the Haitian Project and so has to be away for so much of the time, he took over the baptismal program here, preparing the parents of the children to be baptized as well as performing the baptisms. This has been such a great help to me.

Since her arrival Christina has labored long and hard to find ways to build community spirit here at St. Francis. As you may recall, she began by organizing “family Masses” followed by receptions at the Greenan Center. Over the last year she formed programs that focused on the spiritual, intellectual and social elements of our religious life. There were evenings on Christian meditation, or on estate planning; Fr. Randall was invited to speak on the *Four Quartets* of T. S. Eliot. She arranged for parishioners to lead sessions on painting and for an ice cream social for the children of religious education and their families. She also saw to the inclusion of our youngest parishioners by inviting them to draw what they see in church and display it in the vestibule. In addition, she spearheaded the final landscaping around the outside statue of our Lady with the new wall along the south entrance of the church. And these are only a sampling of all the projects and programs she has organized in her time with us. Over and above all these things, she has carried on the day-to-day ministries of visitations of the sick in the hospital and bringing communion to the shut-ins, as well as training people to visit those who are no longer able to come to Mass.

Now it is my sad duty to announce that the Moynihans are leaving us to move to Florida, where they can be closer to their work in Haiti and where the climate is more amenable to them after 20 years in a tropical country.

They have indicated to me that they’d prefer to leave quietly and without fanfare, especially as they have much packing to do. Christina will leave on Easter Sunday and Deacon Patrick will follow at the end of April. I can’t thank them enough for all their efforts here and wish them all blessings in the coming years!
