

From the Pastor

“We have not here a lasting city,” says the great Epistle to the Hebrews. Here in our parish we are gearing up for two changes in personnel. We have been blessed this summer with the presence of Father Nathan Ricci, who has been an invaluable help to me and a great inspiration for the teens of our parish, especially those who attended the Steubenville East youth conference in July. He’s been able to organize several events for them to help them retain some of the spirit of the event. He also taught in the confirmation program last month and was able to hold the attention of the 10th graders as they explored the teachings and implications of the Christian life. He prepared the parents and baptized the babies of several families and did more than his share of anointings, wakes and funerals. The only parochial experience we were not able to afford him was the pleasure of doing a wedding. He has also been great company for me and the staff and a pleasure to have in the rectory. There will be a farewell coffee an’ after the 10 A.M Mass at the chapel next Sunday and another at the church on Labor Day weekend, his last weekend with us before he returns to Rome to complete his license in Canon Law. He has promised to return to us on Christmas Eve and celebrate the 4:30 vigil Mass.

The other change is more unexpected: our music director, Stephen Higgins, has announced that he will be leaving us at the end of the month to become the organist at the shrine of Our Lady of La Sallette in Attleboro. We wish him all the best in his new position and we thank him for all his labors among us over the last two and a half years

So now we’re in the process of searching for a new director of music, no easy task. In the meantime, Karen Graham, the organist at the chapel, has graciously agreed to cover most of the Masses in the church as well. Mark Castro and Jen Bernard have also been generous enough to fill in at the 10 A.M. until more permanent arrangements can be made. Please pray that we can find someone soon who can settle into the position and continue the work of leading the choir and enhancing the liturgy with worthy music.
