

...on the Mercy of God

- ◆ We find, then, that even so very brief a prayer as *Kyrie, eleison* follows the general rule that praise and thanksgiving come first and the petition flows from these. Because you are our Lord, who passed victoriously through death to life, therefore we pray you: Have mercy on us and on the whole world. The petition means more than ‘Help us!’ It means: ‘Take all of us with you on your journey through death to life.’”

If we interpret the *Kyrie, eleison* in this way, we can understand how one of the greatest spiritual men of the East, Nicholas Cabasilas, could say, back in the fourteenth century: “This prayer can express everything at once.” Cabasilas meant that it is really enough simply to commend ourselves, our dear ones, and the whole world to the redeeming mercy of him who died and rose for us.


