## If He Wants

Ever since my son suffered a devastating injury that left him totally disabled, of course my husband and I pray daily for him. And God has worked wonders in our lives. But sometimes, watching him so helpless, unable even to scratch an itch, I am plunged into anxiety: Am I praying enough? Are my prayers fervent enough? Do I offer the right things up? Have I chosen the right intercessors? If I had more faith, would my son be healed?

I was in that mood, brooding on those questions, when the day's Gospel rescued me. It was the story of the leper standing by the side of the road, calling out to Jesus, "If you want, you can make me clean." Those words lit up my heart like a lightning strike. If he wants....My son's suffering is not about me, not a test of my faith, not a trap to catch my mind wandering. I can rest, trusting that his inscrutable plan is for our good; that physical healing may or may not come (as he wants) but that everything is pouring out from his love. God wants what is good; the love my son receives and inspires is an immeasurable gift.

Comforted by these words, I could return to my day, knowing that my family's travels on this daunting and difficult journey are guided not by the weak and faltering light of my faith, but by the strong and sure hand of our loving Father.
