

SEPTEMBER 22, 2019

From the Pastor,

The 81st anniversary of the hurricane of September 21, 1938 makes us more aware of the suffering of the people, like those of Barbados, whose lives are turned upside down by natural disasters. At the same time, we are grateful that we have not had so destructive a storm in our area since then, although hurricane Carol in 1954 was certainly a very violent and harmful event. Even St. Thomas Aquinas was not sure how much God directly caused the phenomena of nature; he thought that some things were the result of the movement of the stars or the current sign of the Zodiac. Traditional Islamic theology does not recognize secondary causes: Allah causes everything directly. If you hold a stick in the fire, Allah lights the stick. Christian theology accepts secondary causes. While the existence of God makes all movements and other causes possible, God is not the direct cause of all things. When you hold a stick in the fire, the fire lights the stick. So we can believe that the forces of nature operate according to their own laws while at the same time we can hold that God is the ultimate Uncaused Cause that makes all things possible. Still, the death and resurrection of Christ give us an insight as to how God can operate in events that seems like disasters at the time. But this is often hidden from our view. "We walk by faith, not by sight," said St. Paul. "Now we see indistinctly as in mirror; one day we shall see face to face."
