

ST. VINCENT DEPAUL SOCIETY SECOND COLLECTION NEXT WEEK



Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it.—Proverbs 3:27

Feed the hungry and help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness, and the darkness around you will be as bright as noon.—Isaiah 58:10.

Our parish has certainly given evidence of heeding these scripture passages. While SVDP offers service to those in need, our primary goal is to grow spiritually – those of us who are Vincentians as well as those who support our work. The amazing gift response from the giving tree will provide resources for our conference throughout the year. Cards from grocery stores, CVS, Job Lot and Marshalls will allow our clients to shop for themselves independently and with dignity. VISA, MC and American Express cards can be used for our new car repair program. Assistance with car repairs has been a frequent but difficult request to manage. Our clients often have older cars needing repairs beyond our resources. Yet these vehicles provide essential transportation to jobs and medical appointments for families. We have begun a new program in coordination with Chariho High School's Career and Technical Center. Our conference will pay for parts and the school will provide the labor. The students will have experience with a variety of cars, and we will be able to provide assistance at reasonable costs. Two tires for a client's car were recently replaced for a total of \$187.00.

Assistance with housing continues to be a frequent request and was 57% of our financial aid this past year. Some of our clients have been impacted by the recent decrease in food assistance. Only 1% of our funds has been used for any operating expenses, 99% went for direct financial assistance. We have now helped over 100 families, a total of 225 people.

New members are welcome at any time. Call the conference phone at 401-871-8936 and leave your contact information. An associate member can be involved on a part time basis for as little as 3 hours a month, attending one meeting and one home visit.

Thank you for making our work possible as together we continue to help our neighbors in need.
