




SANCTUARY LAMP

From the Pastor,

I supposed I should not have been surprised at the anti-Catholic article in last Sunday's Journal from the Associated Press. Loaded language such as that the RC Church "used a special and unprecedented exemption...to amass at least \$1.4 billion in tax-payer-backed coronavirus aid...." And "the Church's haul." A cursory reading of the article would give the impression that the Catholic Church received federal funds to put in the bank or to pay off civil suits.

Some dioceses are "corporations sole;" in our diocese, each parish is a separate corporation whose president in the bishop and vice-president is the vicar general; the pastor is the secretary and treasurer, and there are two lay trustees. We are bound by law to hold an annual corporation meeting and to submit our financial report to the state. Because of the unique situation caused by the pandemic, we were able to qualify for a forgivable loan called the "Paycheck Protection Program" so that the many people employed by the Church would not be cut adrift without income. The money lent us here has gone <u>entirely</u> to cover people's salaries, not to be put in the bank or used for other purposes. How this is now being portrayed as some kind of con job is beyond me. I fear that the US culture, which was among the most religious in the world, is becoming more and more antireligious, where everything is portrayed in the worst possible light. There is also long and very ingrained strain of anti-Catholicism in the English speaking world and it seems that any dig at the Catholic Church is coming back into fashion. How is it that an attack on a synagogue or mosque is a "hate crime" but an attack on the property of a Catholic church is not even reported in the media?

Five years ago, Father Nick Smith returned to St. Francis's to give the Lenten mission. His theme was that it takes fortitude to remain faithful to Catholicism in the contemporary world. He mentioned several moral issues in which people wish to depart from the morality of the New Testament and said, "But the Church is 'in the way." Yes, it is. You may notice that the liberal ecclesiastical communities come under no such scrutiny as we do. Maybe the Catholic Church is the only religion worth paying any attention to.
