



From the Pastor,

This year's celebration of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, comes with a special cause for rejoicing in our parish: the ordination and First Mass of Thanksgiving of our parishioner Dan Mahoney. Without the priesthood, there would be no celebration of the Eucharist, "the source and summit of the Christian life" according to the Second Vatican Council.

If we were to sum up the duties of the priesthood from widest to narrowest, it would be first "to preach the gospel and teach the Catholic faith." I say this is the widest responsibility because it is addressed to the whole world and to every aspect of human society. Second, the priest is charged with "building up the Christian community." This includes the day-to-day duties of administration and the oversight of various ministries and committees within the Catholic community. Finally, the priest's highest calling is "to sanctify the Catholic people" especially by the celebration of the sacraments, most notably the Holy Eucharist.

In reality all three of these duties interpenetrate one another: for example, preaching is especially part of the first duty but is also involved with forming and with sanctifying those who have already responded to the call of faith.

With his ordination to the diaconate, Fr. Dan has already begun to exercise the office of preaching in an official way. As he is ordained to the priesthood in the rank of presbyter, he will become a celebrant of the sacraments of Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and above all, the Holy Eucharist. We pray that he will have a long and fruitful ministry among the People of God!

As he reminds us, 'attending mass is a great privilege and an incomparable source of grace and peace'. As we return to pre-pandemic life, let us be reminded of why we attend Mass. We do so because we love God and want to thank Him for all the gifts and blessings He has given us. We attend Mass to hear His sacred Word proclaimed, to join Jesus in his self-offering to the Father, to receive Jesus fully in the Holy Eucharist and to be with other members of our faith community.
- ♦ We will continue to live stream the 9am Sunday mass for parishioners who are not able to join us in person.
