

Last week I was at St. Barnabas in Portsmouth for a "Grill the Priest" evening. Participants could ask the panel of 3 priests anything they wanted. No topic was off limits! We did get an interesting question: "With Halloween approaching, why can't Catholics use Ouija boards?"

A Ouija board is a "game" where participants ask spirits of the dead to answer questions through moving a board piece over letters of the alphabet. It's true that Catholics should avoid 'like the plague' this, and similar activities (tarot cards, palm readers, psychics, astrology, etc.) We priests gave 3 reasons:

1. The bible forbids it! Leviticus 19:31, Leviticus 20:6, Deutoronomy 18:10, Acts 16:16, to name a few. I'll leave it to you to look them up at home.

2. It invites spirits that are not looking out for our good. When we "consult" with spirits, we are opening a door into a dangerous world. The devil is always out to trick us. "Be sober and alert, our opponent the devil is prowling like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him solid in your faith" 1 Peter 5:8.

3. It takes glory away from God! God has a plan for us. He guides us and gently lets our souls know His will. When we consult psychics, etc. we are trying to gain knowledge in a way other than through God. That's just what tempted Adam and Eve. They wanted to have the knowledge of God!

So, Halloween is certainly a fun time especially for the young ones. Enjoy! But remember that it is a Catholic holiday where we give honor to All the Saints. May they intercede for us!

This event includes: Over 16 craft/vendors tables, a silent auction, bake sale, and a café for drinks and a lunch menu.




