Dear Parishioners,

I remember my first Palm Sunday as a priest. After Mass an older woman went to the table where the palms were located and grabbed as much as her arms could hold. The pastor leaned over to me and said, "What is she going to do? Make soup with it??" It makes me chuckle 12 years later!

There are so many traditions associated with palms. The Italian tradition is to bring them to the gravesites of our beloved dead. French Canadians will often weave ornate cones out of the palm. In England, there is a tradition of Pax Cakes, where the priest would hand out a small loaf of bread and say "peace and good". Many of us place blessed palm behind picture frames in our houses to remind us that Christ is our King all year around.

Whatever your traditions are, it is an important Sunday for Catholics. Mass begins with the words "Hosanna to the Son of David". The original Aramaic is translated as something like "Praise and salvation from the Son of David!". Then we read the Passion account and we recall the road to Jerusalem ends with the Crucifixion. Palm Sunday, in conjunction with Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil gives us the FULL liturgical expression of what Jesus did for us. I highly recommend that you try to attend all the services of the Sacred Triduum. If you can't please read the Mass readings at home this week.

the outside of the envelope so that when the repair is complete you can be notified. Please drop your envelope off at the rectory or place it in the black mailbox next to the rectory door.




We are glad that you are here with us this morning. Whether you moved here a while ago or are just here for a brief stay, we welcome you.

St. Francis of Assisi's Annual Easter Egg Hunt will take place on Easter Sunday morning at 10:00!! The Easter Bunny will sup-


