

Dear Parishioners,

In the wake of the Supreme Court leak on Roe vs. Wade, I had the impulse to write a treatise on why abortion is the greatest modern evil. But you and I both know what the Church teaches, so there is no need to repeat *ad nauseum*.

If we are going to advocate for the protection of life, and show love for both mothers and unborn children, then it is time to "put our money where our mouth is", so to say. One blatant lie often told is that opponents of abortion are only "pro birth" and don't care about the child and the mother after birth. That is patently untrue. If (and it's a big IF) Roe vs. Wade is overturned, we must continue to make our parish a place where any pregnant woman can come without judgement for whatever she needs.

We must also throw our energy behind advocacies and legislation for single mothers, poor families, child wellness, etc. In Rhode Island, childcare costs 27% of an average family's annual income. That's outrageous! (The HHS says anything over 7% is 'unaffordable'). It's time to hold our law-makers accountable for these issues. They rammed through pro abortion legislation in 2019 in less than a month. They can do the same for laws to help families.

Lastly, and I want this to be loud and clear. No woman who has had an abortion should ever feel ostracized from the church family. They shouldn't feel unwanted, unredeemable, unwelcome. The church is a hospital and an oasis of mercy. The end of abortion won't come from protests, arguments, or even laws. It will come from a culture change away from the "throwaway culture" Pope Francis describes, and a culture that values every single individual human person.

St. Vincent DePaul Society



Catholic Schools Arts Festival


