



Dear Parishioners,

It's no secret that the priest talks a lot during Mass. To God, to the congregation, (if something goes wrong he might talk to himself!) You may notice that at certain points during the Mass, the priest says prayers inaudibly. These are called the "private prayers". In the old days they were called the "secret" prayers. They are a dialogue between the priest himself and God. I want to share with you those prayers I say in hopes that it may enrich your experience of the Mass.

Before reading the Gospel, you notice the priest bows in front of the altar. While we do that we say, "Cleanse my heart and my lips, almighty God, that I may worthily proclaim your holy Gospel". Then again after we finish, we kiss the Gospel and say, "Through the words of the Gospel, may our sins be wiped away."

As the Mass continues and the gifts of bread and wine are offered on the table, we are preparing for their transformation into the Body and Blood of Christ. The priest says, "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God."

So you can see the common thread is asking God that we be worthy to celebrate and approach these important heavenly mysteries! I'll share more with you next week.


