



#### Taken From September Magnificat

What is humility? True humility is to know that, of myself, I am nothing. But with God, I am able to do anything. In the Prayer of Saint Francis we say: Lord, make me an instrument of your love.

God is a very warm-hearted and jealous lover. He loves us much more than to let us go astray. If we are foolish enough to deceive ourselves, he will shake us up once in a while to show us who we really are. He gives us an experience of our own littleness. I will see that I am not as great as I thought I was. We can have two kinds of reactions when we see our littleness. We can say, "Oh well, that's jus how I am," or "Everybody is against me, nobody understand me!" Or we can realize that God is trying to show us how little we are and how much we need to depend on him.

We do not want to run on our own fuel-power. We want to live by faith, to look out for his will. Humbly tell our Lord: "Thank you, Lord. Thank you for showing me to me as I am. I beg your help because I need your help so badly." This is what humility is: to accept, to ask, to depend on him and on his help. God is very willing to give us his all: just think of the love of our Lord, of redemption, or the Mass!

Jesus died, he gave himself to the heavenly Father. But that was his sacrifice; how does this become my sacrifice: What can make it mine? He became man; he wanted to share the nature I have. He became our brother, looked like us, spoke our language. He established the Church, his Mystical Body, so that we are not only brothers but his members. When we are in the state of grace, Christ's Spirit is our own spirit? He established the Holy Eucharist. He wanted to be food for our body and soul. He hid himself in the bread. He invites us to Mass, which is going on every day and minute all over the world. And he made his sacrifice mine. Bow down before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Thank him very wholeheartedly for his all-giving love. Ask him sincerely to open your eyes to see the great reality that is himself, and yourself. Ask him to me your heart meek and humble according to his own heart.—Sister Ida Peterfy

#### SANCTUARY LAMP

This week's sanctuary lamp at St. Francis Church burns in memory of Ralph Calitri.



Our Friday Dinner Table, sponsored by SVDP St. Francis Conference, has now served more than 14,000 meals since January 2021. Weekly requests have recently increased to nearly 190 meals. Our parish donors and more than 70 volunteers continue to make this program possible.

August was a busy month for our SVDP Conference. We assisted nine families and our neighbors in need. The main requests for financial aid continue to be for rent and utilities; two families were assisted with rent and four families with overdue electric and gas bills. Several of these payments prevented electrical shut offs. Unexpected medical expenses can deplete finances for families managing paycheck to paycheck. A family with three children had a premature baby with an extended NICU stay, and the head of the household sustained a disabling injury in a motor vehicle accident. They were assisted with utility bills. A single parent of a young child with emotional problems who was being bullied was helped to relocate to another apartment. Storage fees were paid to prevent the sale of belongings for a neighbor who had lost a job he had held for 25 years and was beginning a new job at much lower pay. Two neighbors whose employment required a car were assisted with the cost of repairs.

We remind our grateful recipients that our support comes from generous parishioners. We thank the donors who use the poor boxes in the Church and Chapel in addition to the many online donations that make this work possible. Bring your dogs, cats, hamsters, gerbils, birds, fish, ferrets, chickens, turtles, etc. for a special St. Francis blessing!





#### FUNERAL ASSISTANCE
