



Make straight the pathway for the Lord.

We hear often from the prophet Isaiah during this season of Advent. God's people are suffering, and the prophet continues to assure them that the Lord is with them. Advent is a time of waiting, a time of preparing. It is appropriate, then, that this season is filled with readings from Isaiah, who calls the people to pray and prepare for God's promises to be fulfilled.

As Christians, many centuries after the prophet Isaiah, we recognize that Jesus is the answer to these promises. In our Gospel today, Jesus sees the suffering of the people and he is moved with pity for them. Jesus is the restoration and salvation that was promised by the prophets. Jesus heals the sick. Jesus expels demons. Then he sends out his Apostles to do these same miracles in his name. Just as the prophets promised that the Lord would help the sick and the imprisoned, here now is the Son of God coming to fulfill the promises that were made.

What God has promised, his Son has done in his name. As the Apostles were sent, so is the Church tasked to preach the Gospel to all: "To make all share in the communion between the Father and the Son in their Spirit of love" (*CCC* 850). Jesus calls us to care for the sick so that they may experience his healing touch. God asks us to oppose the evils of the devil so that people can experience deliverance from his control.

Just as Jesus brought hope to a hurting people, he also sent the Holy Spirit to share that same hope and salvation. We are the body of Christ on earth. The Lord Jesus is continuing to fulfill God's promises through us. The harvest is ripe, but the laborers are few. It is time for us to rise up and gather that harvest for the Master.
