



(Anniversary Remembrance) Requested by Gerri & Al Marsocci By our baptism we are meant to cooperate with the work of building up God's kingdom.

As we enter this final week of Advent, the Gospel turns our attention to the role of Saint Joseph in salvation history. When we ponder the mystery of the Incarnation, our attention is often focused on Mary, our Blessed Mother, and the way God prepared her for her central role as Mother to our Lord Jesus Christ, to the Church, and to all of us. But what about Joseph? He remains a bit more of a mystery, a shadow in the background of these momentous events when the Son of God took on human flesh, became fully human, and united humankind to the divine life forever.

But, if we focus on today's readings in which Joseph plays a role, we can glean some insights and lessons about God and our path of discipleship.

First, as we hear in the story, God invites Joseph's cooperation in his plan of salvation. We see this in Scripture time and again, and it is true in our own lives as well. If we were in God's seat, we might choose to force people into submission and to comply with our will, but this is not how God operates. God wants to win us over and wants to see us participate in the building up of his kingdom.

Second, what is the obstacle the angel identifies? Fear. *Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home,* says the angel. Do not be afraid to do this strange thing that runs counter to what you know, to what seems sensible, and even just. Might this be true in our own lives? Might we be afraid to move forward with a choice we know in our hearts is what God wants us to do, but are hesitant because it just doesn't make sense from a worldly perspective?

As Advent draws to a close, let us spend some time pondering these two questions: How is God inviting me to cooperate with the slow work of building up his kingdom, in my own heart, in my family and friendships, in the community? And, examining my heart, how is fear posing an obstacle to my cooperation? As we ponder these questions, let us ask Saint Joseph to intercede for us and show us how to respond with graciousness and humility, with trust and courage, to the Lord's invitation.




CHRISTMAS CARD RAFFLE
