In the first reading, the Apostle Philip has come to Samaria to preach the Gospel among the Gentiles, who are amazingly receptive to what he tells them. The word is powerful there as demons are cast out many of the sick

Gospel among the Gentiles, who are amazingly receptive to what he tells them. The word is powerful there as demons are cast out, many of the sick are healed, and great joy fills the city. In Jesus' name by the power of the Holy Spirit, the Apostles enjoy great success on this first missionary journey beyond the borders of Judah.

In the second reading, Saint Peter tells us to *always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope.* He tells us to defend the faith with *gentleness and reverence*, both for the word we preach and the audience with whom we share it. Peter rightly assumes that the message will at times be met with hostility, but we must persevere, for *it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil.*

In today's Gospel, we are with Jesus and his Apostles in the Upper Room at the Last Supper. With only hours to live, Jesus speaks of the cross, the resurrection, his ascension into heaven and the descent of the Holy Spirit. Nine times in this brief passage of six verses, John the Evangelist uses the word "will" to show all the good that God has in store for us in Christ. Jesus makes many promises that he will fulfill if only we fulfill one promise in return – to show our love for him by keeping his commands.

Jesus refers to his ascension that we will celebrate in the Church on Thursday, May 18: *In a little while the world will no longer see me*. Through it all, Jesus promises that we will not be left alone or abandoned, for the Advocate, the Holy Spirit of God, will come to us to be our consolation and our strength. This is *the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you.*

Jesus was, is and will always be the reason for our hope. The same Holy Spirit that inspired Philip, Peter, and John dwells in us. Along with the Eucharist we are about to receive, the Spirit helps our minds and hearts to ascend to God. This is all part of God's will for us, and he asks us to use our will to choose love for him first, to love him most, and to love him forever, as he loves us.

What's That Book That the Deacon is Carrying Into Mass?

You may have recently noticed the Deacon carrying a red book in procession and placing it on the altar until the time for the Gospel to be read. At that time the book is raised for all to see and is taken to the ambo

to read the Gospel of the day.

This book, *The Book of the Gospels*, was always considered a symbol of Christ, along with the altar and the cross. It was used from early on in the church and reestablished following the reforms of Vatican II.

The Deacon (or reader in absence of a Deacon) carries the book with great reverence. We venerate this book as it contains the four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. These words and actions of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, when read by the Deacon (or priest in the absence of a Deacon) can help to transform our lives. When we receive these words with the reverence and respect they deserve we literally receive Christ Himself into our minds and hearts.
