



Jesus reveals God's great love for us.

We are nearing the end of the Easter season, and our Gospel passage today from John is Jesus' prayer to the Father before his passion. Jesus knows what lies ahead for him, and this prayer reflects what is on his heart. Even though he is facing brutal suffering, Jesus prays not for his own benefit or relief from pain, but for those he loves: *I pray for them. I* do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours, and everything of mine is yours and everything of yours is mine, and I have been glorified in them. His prayer is for us, that his mission might be fulfilled.

This is a powerful reflection of his love for us. Any of us would understand if this last prayer was for his own strength and courage to get through what he was facing. Instead, he thinks of us. Embodying love, Jesus has dedicated his life to teaching us the way to the Father. He has shown us that we belong to the Father. This has an impact on our whole being.

We see this impact on the earliest disciples: The first reading tells us what the disciples did after they witnessed Jesus' glorious ascension to heaven. They returned to Jerusalem and *devoted themselves with one accord to prayer*. We are told their names, and see that the group includes Jesus' mother and brothers. They have begun their work for the mission Jesus gave them.

Gathered here today, we know that the small group mentioned in this passage has turned into millions and millions throughout the world for centuries. This is the power of living one's life to glorify God.

This incredible spread of Jesus' mission does not happen by accident. It speaks to the power of God's love for us. God knows each of us by name, and calls us to great things with the gifts he has given to us. Jesus has shown us the way, and there is nothing we cannot do because we have the love of God.

During the remainder of the Easter season, may we continue to grow in the light of Christ that has been revealed to us. May we continue to grow in understanding of God's love for us, especially in what we celebrate at the Eucharistic table.




