



### Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

Today's readings raise the perplexing theme that "there is finding in the losing of." This concept goes against simple logic. The whole point of finding is recovering a loss, right? They seem to be opposites—but, really, they are not.

The "losing" of which Jesus speaks is about sacrifice: losing, or giving up, something of ourselves for a greater good or for the good of others. As Christians, we know that sacrifice is at the core of our identity. Take, for instance, the symbol of the cross. It is present throughout our churches, and we wear it around our necks. We know that Jesus, by his cross, taught us the true meaning of sacrifice.

In the first reading, sacrifice is found in the expression of hospitality. The woman of influence, with her means, chooses to use her wealth to show hospitality to the prophet. In sacrificing her time and the space in her home, she ultimately receives the promise of a son. In sacrificing her home for others, she fills her home with joy.

Each one of us has an experience of hospitality like this passage, whether we were the hosts or the recipients of such graciousness. We can recognize the sacrifice that goes into it. Showing love and concern for others requires sacrifice, but it is in the losing that we find the joy of a full, warm home.

In the Gospel, Jesus' words are quite directive: Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. He is teaching us to put aside distractions and to put himself at the center. As much as we are surrounded by the cross, the ultimate symbol of sacrifice, we can lose sight of Jesus' body on the cross: the crucifix. The cross is the symbol, and upon it and carrying it is where true sacrifice takes place. When we put ourselves before others, when we put work before family, when we do not take the time to grow our relationship with God, we are losing sight of the sacrifice we are called to in this life.

It's not easy to be comfortable with sacrifice. It leaves us vulnerable and requires loss. Nevertheless, we have so many models of faith that have shown us the way. All of these holy men and women inspire us to work harder at putting God first. Losing ourselves in order to find our true selves in Christ brings us closer to God.

Jesus gives us the courage to do this, telling us that he is with us every step of the way. May the Eucharist we will soon share renew us and give us the strength to continue to keep Christ at the center of our lives.
