



Have a heart of wonder & attentiveness so as to receive God's fruitful word.

Have you ever watched a seed grow? Remember that childhood educational activity, where a seed is placed in a clear bag and taped to a window so everyone can marvel at the breaking open and bursting forth of new life?

There's a deep anticipation to it, and then, almost miraculously, the seed begins its work, sending out a root searching for water, sending up a small shoot seeking the light.

This powerful image runs through our readings today. God's creative power, poured out to bring forth fruit, nourishment, life. And this is the image Jesus offers us for the creative work he wants to do in our lives. In these readings, God is both sower and seed, the one who gives water and light, the one who calls forth growth, and the one who vields great fruit.

Can we see this work God wants to carry out in our lives? Can we hear his fruitful word?

Just as from the heavens, the rain and snow come down and water the earth; so, too, the word has been sent to us. All of creation awaits with eager expectation, groaning in labor pains. And, in this moment of anticipation, we have the firstfruits of the Spirit.

Can we see the Spirit moving like the wind over the water? Can we hear the Spirit's voice calling us to growth?

Perhaps that image of the seed can call us to see more clearly, to listen more carefully. This seeing and hearing requires a posture of wonder, a posture of careful attentiveness. Like children at the window, can we slow down and marvel, watching with anticipation to see what God will do?

Our God speaks. But God does not usually yell. We are given true freedom to hear and to see. If we are to bear fruit, we must make the choice to receive this grace. We must choose silence, we must choose to set down distractions, we must choose to be attentively present.

Perhaps we can pause today to ask for the light of the Holy Spirit to shine on what might impede our capacity to see and to hear Christ. We may also consider our responses in the light of Jesus' warnings. If we are facing tribulations or persecutions, are we sinking our roots deeply into the water of the sacraments? In the face of worldly anxieties, are we seeking the light through meditation on God's word and reception of the Eucharist?

Today, may we be nourished for the profound work of seeing and hearing God's word. May this Eucharist draw us to wonder and attentiveness. May God call us in this Mass to enter into the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven and send us forth to bear great fruit for his kingdom.

SANCTUARY LAMP


This week's sanctuary lamp at St. Francis Church burns in memory of Selma Gallo.


