



When we surrender to God with a humble heart, we find our burdens are lighter.

Freedom, strength, leadership...these words can sometimes seem completely in opposition to meekness and humility.

The Jews, who were expecting a strong military type of messiah, may have been disappointed by Jesus who came riding into Jerusalem on a donkey instead of a warhorse-the one who submitted to a violent execution, not one who fomented a violent revolution.

But imagine the strength found in the meekness of Christ! The strength in the humility of the saints and martyrs! Those whose wills are so perfectly united to that of the Father are more free than any of us who have struggled and battled internally.

And how incredible it is that we can look to Christ as an example. If we take up his yoke, we lighten our burden because he shares it with us. When our will is conformed to Christ, we are motivated by love and truth itself.

It may be difficult to overcome temptations, and all of us have our own battles. But as we become more free from these passions, the burdens become lighter. The yoke of Christ is easy because it is Christ who carries it with us.

Christian strength and freedom may seem opposed to the ideas of meekness and humility. But instead consider that great strength, and finding real freedom in Christ, can only happen when our hearts are meek and humble, and we surrender fully to God.


#### **Adoration Adorers**

invitation to our parish to share in their work through our financial support and the support of our prayer.


