

Projects in the Works:

Looking at the current and future needs of our parish, it would be truly a blessing to have the kitchen renovated in Fr. Greenan Hall to make it a full commercial kitchen which would include a convection oven, new stove, more refrigeration, ansul system, dishwasher, dumbwaiter, along with more storage space. By renovating the kitchen, we will be able to easily support our parish dinners. Hopefully this will also increase the use of the Hall to hold more events in the future.

The Diocese of Providence facilities manager did come up to the Hall and has given us (our building commission) some guidance on how to proceed with this project and to let us know what we need to do to get their final approval. The blueprints have already been drawn up. The intention is to hold fundraisers for this project along with approaching possible donors as to eliminate or minimize the expense to the parish.

The Saint Vincent de Paul Society would like to move their "Friday Meal Program" from the Peace Dale Congregational Church to our Hall upon completion of this project. The increasing number of meals that they make, most of them being delivered to homes, is outpacing their current capacity.

The lighting on the 2nd floor of the Hall also needs to be upgraded. The current lighting is inadequate. At some point, I would like to bring back the basketball hoops with the idea of having some sporting activities available to our youth along with all our parishioners.

We are waiting to get word on the final approval from the Diocese for the painting of the Church. The paint on the wood trim all along the church including the windows and doors is peeling off and will eventually expose the wood to the weather. The low bid for this project came in at \$105,000. The bell tower and the wrought iron fence (at the front and side of the church) also need to be painted. Hopefully these will be tended to in the spring of next year.

Our Parish Council and the Finance Council are in support of these projects. If you have any questions or you would like more details regarding any of these projects, please contact me directly and I will be happy to go over with you any current information I have at hand. I will keep you posted as we move along with these projects.


