



True leadership is exercised through sacrificial gift of self.

The greatest among you must be your servant. This comes from the greatest servant leader, Jesus Christ, who showed us that true leadership is demonstrated through service, through the laying down of one's life on behalf of another. His gift of self, epitomized on the cross, raises each of us up to new life.

The scribes and Pharisees of Jesus' day failed to understand this kind of leadership. They were more concerned with the outward appearance of power - being called "rabbi," for instance - than serving their people in love. In elevating themselves over others, they struggled to recognize the shared humanity of those they led.

Paul reminds the Thessalonians how Christ's disciples led them, Working night and day in order not to burden any of you, we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. In his Letter to the Thessalonian Church, Paul likens himself not to a ruler or rabbi – the ones with the seeming authority – but to a nursing mother. Gentle, affectionate, and selflessly giving of themselves for the common good in Christ's holy

Jesus shows leadership perfected all throughout the Gospel. He didn't simply point a finger and command his followers to do his bidding. No, Christ rolled up his sleeves and got dirty alongside his disciples, working alongside those he led for the kingdom of God. Even when he knew there was a traitor among his disciples, Jesus dropped to his knees to wash and kiss their feet, practicing what he preached about servant leadership so the Apostles would fully understand and go forth to do the same as they spread the Gospel message.

Christ's message is clear to all of us: The greatest among you must be your servant. To love as he did in his time on earth, to love as God does always and in all ways, we must preach a life of service, and then practice what we preach. May the word of God, now at work in [us] who believe, give us the humility and strength to accomplish this task.
